On Thursday 27th March a PIFWC search was held in Pale at the homes of three families suspected of being involved with the Radovan Karadzic support network. A week later, on Wednesday 2nd April, a PIFWC search was held in Krupac at the home of Dragan Draskovic, suspected of being a part of the same support network. On 22nd April, the Banja Luka home of Goran Marinkovic was also raided for the same reasons. These were the first search operations for a few months. See Page 9.



At the ceremony, COM EUFOR, General Villalain stated:



EUFOR and AFBIH Combined Training now at Company Level



BIH (AFBIH). This training is part of a series of combined military exercises with AFBIH. The training started on 11th April at Comanche Base near Tuzla.

Growing co-operation

Previous combined training has been at a platoon level of 30 soldiers, but this latest exercise has been at a Company level of 100 soldiers, demonstrating the growing co-operation between EUFOR and AFBIH and the improving operational effectiveness of AFBIH. The training during the week has included: check point operation, patrolling exercises, mine removal exercises, and radio communication training.

In January the AFBIH stated that 2008 would be a year of training and we are now seeing this in action as the training starts at the Company level. These exercises have proved the capability and professionalthem work together so successfully.

EUFOR's mission is to contribute to the safe and secure environment in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and this training will greatly assist with this mission. EUFOR PIFWC Operations

EUFOR conducted two search operation at the request of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (ICTY). EUFOR conducted a search operation on 27th March in premises in Pale of people probably connected to the Radovan Karadzic support network. EUFOR then conducted a second operation in Krupac on 2nd April in the premises of Dragan Draskovic, who is also believed to be associated with the Radovan Karadzic support network. On 22nd April a third operation was held in Banja Luka at the home of Goran Marinkovic. Again, he was suspected of supporting the Radovan Karadzic network. The aim of all these search operations was to find material or information which could assist the ICTY in the ongoing search for and capture of Persons Indicted For War Crimes

> operations were supported by NATO and were closely coordinated with the ICTY.

The local police, RS MuP, were informed of the operations and provided support. EUFOR commended them for professionalism,

EUFOR is heartened to see Mr Ljajic (President of the Serbian National Council for Cooperation with the ICTY) announce that the Serbian authorities were close to catching Zupiljanin in the last week of March. This is in addition to the pleas from the Zupiljanin family who wish him to give himself up.

Rewards on offer

All readers are reminded that any person providing information that leads to the arrest or conviction, in any country, of a war criminal indicted by the ICTY may be eligible for a reward. A reward of up to approximately 4 million Euro or 8 million KM may be paid for Radovan Karadzic, Ratko Mladic, Goran Hadzic or Stojan Zupljanin. Individuals' holding such information should call BIH 065.516.674 if outside or 00.387.65.516.674 or e-mail mail@rewardsforjustice.net

It was recently announced that there are also rewards on offer from Serbia for information leading to the capture of the war criminals. Serbia has put up a number of rewards, including up to 250,000 Euros for Zupiljanin.

"Guarda Nacional Republicana" (GNR) is a Portuguese Police Force, consisting of 24,500 military personnel, organized in a special body of troops, with authority from the Internal Affairs Ministry, with the aim of upholding the Law, Security and Public Order.

The homeland GNR Corps daily tasks are extensive and include duties as criminal police; administrative police; road traffic supervision and regulation; customs and fiscal police; nature and environment protection; search and rescue; honorific and State Representation, Close Protection of VIPs, and "Robust Police Missions" in and outside Portuguese territory.

GNR is participating in Operation ALTHEA as a founder member of the newly created European Gendarmerie Force (EGF). This multinational initiative of five European police forces with military status (France, Italy, Netherlands, Portugal and Spain), is considered to be a new tool for Crisis Management Operations, at the disposal of the European Union.

It is a robust International Police Force, specialized in Crime Fighting activities within the theatre of operations, with military structure and capabilities, able to operate under military or civilian command and control in both benign and hostile environments.






120 years of the National Museum

The oldest scientific and cultural institution in BIH - the National Museum, commemorated 120 years of existence at the celebration held on 7 February. As was emphasized at the ceremony, there are only a few institutions in this part of Europe that can be proud of over a century of continuous work. Testimonies about the rich cultural, natural and historic heritage of BIH have been archived in Archeological department, Ethnology department, the Natural Science department, and in the Library of the National Museum. In this region, the National Museum was founded on 1 February 1888 as a state-owned institution. It managed to survive despite the unfortunate situations that were its constant companions. Two very significant exhibitions

prepared by the employees of the museum were opened at the ceremony on 7 February. The exhibitions will be open to the public by the end of the year.



The first exhibition has been named «The Art of Antique Mosaics in BIH». The author of the exhibition, the archeologist of the National Museum Adnan Busuladzic, MSc exhibited 28 mosaics from the developed and late period of the Roman Empire (1 - 2 century AD)that are being kept in the museum.

Around 50 antique mosaics have been





found in the territory of BIH. Analysis has shown identical patterns to the mosaics in other parts of the Roman Empire. An interesting fact is that, among the motifs from the mosaics found in BIH, there are also many



maritime motifs and not only from the territory near the Adriatic Sea. A mosaic with maritime nuptials was found near Ilidza and mosaics with motifs related to the Roman god of the sea Neptune, fish and dolphins were also found.

"Which Shirt is Mine?"

The exhibition "Which shirt is mine?" is a work by the ethnologist of the National Museum, Svetlana Bajic. The author exhibited 50 female shirts and 12 accessories and shirt textiles that date to the middle 19th century and to the late 1980s. The author aims to show the public at least one segment of the material culture of Bosnian women, villages and cities, and to encourage a better understanding of the Bosnian but also European identity, in a museological and ethnological way.

Saving The Hagada

The National Museum was almost on the front line from 1992 to 1995 and this period represents the hardest time in its entire history. It must never be forgotten that, during the war, the posi-

tion of the museum's director was held by two great men Almaz Dautbegovic and Rizah Sijaric. Unfortunately, Sijaric were killed on duty, which represents a truly rare situation in the world - someone dying while trying to protect his country's national heritage.



Turkey

Turkey (Turkish: Türkiye), known officially as the Republic of Turkey, is a Eurasian country that stretches across the Anatolian peninsula in western Asia and Thrace (Rumelia) in the Balkan

northwest; Greece to the west, Georgia to the northeast; Armenia, Azerbaijan (the exclave of Nakhichevan), and Iran to the east; and Iraq and Syria to the southeast. The Mediterranean Sea is to the south; the Aegean Sea and Archipelago are to the west; and the Black Sea is to the north. Separating Anatolia and Thrace are the Sea of Marmara and the Turkish Straits (the Bosporus and the Dardanelles), which are commonly acknowledged to delineate the border between Asia and Europe, thereby making Turkey transcontinental.

Turkey is a democratic, secular, unitary, constitutional republic whose political system

was established in 1923 under the leadership of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, following the fall of the Ottoman Empire in the aftermath of World War I. Since then, Turkey has become increasingly integrated with the West through membership in organizations such as the Council of Europe (1949), NATO (1952), OECD (1961), OSCE (1973) and the G20 industrial nations (1999). Turkey began full membership negotiations with the European Union in 2005, having been an associate member since 1963, and having reached a customs union agreement in 1995.

LOT Gradiska donation

On Friday 28th of March LOT Gradiska visited two schools, one in the AoR Gradiska southern part, and one in AoR Dubica western part. The reason for the visit was a planned donation to the

pupils of the particular schools. Two weeks before, the members of LOT Gradiska decided to organize a donation for schools.

The children mostly come from farming families, which don't have a lot of income. They struggle to provide all the money for the children's schoolbooks and other necessary material. LOT prepared gift bags for each child. Inside could be found a ruler, some pens, some pencils, color pens, a rubber, four notebooks, a notepad, chewing gum and a flyer of LOT Gradiska, all neatly wrapped in a paper bag provided by LOT/EUFOR. Notebooks, paper bags and

some pencils were provided by EUFOR and financial donation from LOT members provided 140KM and made it possible to add other useful things. The school in AOI Dubica has 10 pupils and one

teacher; it is a very poor branch school of the main school of Knezica.

When the LOT team members entered the classroom all the kids stood up and greeted them. The pupils' eyes began to shine and glow, when the team handed over the gift bags. The children were really thankful and very happy. In the rural areas, where the parents don't have a lot of money, even a very small gift can make a child very happy. Each one of them thanked the LOT team many times for the precious gifts they received. When the LOT team left the building the children all came out and waved.

LOT House Re-Organisation

EUFOR announced or ganisational changes to the Liaison Observation Team (LOT) house structure in northern Bosnia Herzegovina on 7th April. EUFOR's LOT house network operates within a system of five Regional Co-

ordination Centres (RCCs) across the country. Each LOT and region is largely manned by staff from a EUFOR contributing nation.

The LOT house system provides the eyes and ears on the ground for EUFOR, con-

ings will help to enable EUFOR to maintain the system and go on providing local reassurance and contact.

The re-organisation affects the LOT House at Doboj, which has been manned by a Polish contingent from 13th April 2008.

You'll find Champagne and good liqueurs like cognac, so if you're looking for a nice drop to drink you might be in the right



place. You can also buy some perfume for your girlfriend - or boyfriend. It's not the cheapest shop for this but you can choose from a lot of fragrances. Generally the prices are on the middle level compared to other PXs in Butmir. If you want to buy a trendy, sporty or classic watch, then la Boutique de France is the place for you.

Spanish PX

The Spanish PX is a small, natty and cozy shop with a real Spanish flavor.

When entering the Spanish PX, you will be welcomed by a friendly staff who offer you an interesting range of products at



quite competitive prices. It is highly recommended you take a close look at the perfumes, which come not only from Spain, but also from the most well-known perfume brands. The unique "brave bull" from the Iberian Peninsula is stamped on a wide variety of nice articles. If you wish to share with your family a taste of the Spanish sea, you can purchase several different kinds of canned fish.

However, of most interest is the variety of wines from Spain, a country with more than 50 different types of wine. You will find a good selection of Spanish wines at impressive prices for their quality; wines from the famous areas of Rioja, Penedes, Sherry or Cava, and different varieties: red, white, rose and sparkling. Sangria, this typical Spanish drink, can also be found.

The PX is open every day of the week, from 10AM to 8PM from Monday to Sunday.

"Zum Krämer" - The German PX

Dining Facility you will
find the small PX of the
German Military
Contingent in Camp
Butmir. You can't miss
the blue containers with



the big logo. The range of goods is not very large, but they do offer competitive prices and you get a good bargain when buying a Festina Watch or a Rowenta Lighter. Perfumes, cigarettes and sweets are offered as well as toiletries, but you will not find liquors sold in the shop.

Prices for sunglasses are not too high compared to other northern nation PXs in Butmir that seem to target impulse buyers. Germans, Swiss and Austrians might be interested in the variety of German language magazines and books you can buy there. And last but not least, the staff are always friendly and ready to help you whether you are looking for sunglasses or a watch.

The PX is open 7 days a week, Monday to Friday 9am – 7pm, Saturday and Sunday 10am – 7pm.

Italian PX

The Italian PX is situated behind the Millennium Bar, next to the American PX. It is a small, friendly PX with a relatively small range of goods for sale. Nevertheless, they are all useful. All the usual goods found in all the PXs are there, such as clothes, electrical goods, perfume and food, but with an Italian flavour, of course. The Italian biscuits snacks looked particularly inviting.

Prices looked reasonable compared to others, and the quality of the goods for sale looked good. The reviewer only sampled a little Italian chocolate, which was very tasty!

The PX is open every day of the week, from 10AM to 8PM from Monday to Saturday, and from 10AM to 7Pm on Sundays.



Danish PX

The Danish PX can be found in the IPU part of Butmir Camp, close to the IPU Dining Facility. It is well laid out, and of a reasonable size. There is a good range of all sorts of items for sale, and there is plenty of room to view them. Prices looked reasonable, and it is well worth the extra walk from the main camp to have a look around. The outdoor clothing for the Danish winter looked particularly interesting, and you can

even buy a casino table cloth for those extra special parties. There didn't seem to be a huge range of purely Danish goods, and the range was generally pretty international, but the quality looks very reasonable.

There was a noticeably large range of confectionary for sale, and the chocolate also tasted good at this PX!

The American PX is located in the heart of Camp Butmir's "PX land". It is right next the Italian and Norwegian PXs.

The PX offers a wide variety of all sorts of items, from baseball bats to video games and from small delicacies to electronic equipment. It is worth noting that the prices are all in dollars.

Most people will visit the American PX to check up on the latest electronic equipment, such as laptops, TVs, iPods, cameras and so on. The PX also offers a wide selection of DVD movies which are also avail-



able for loan. The American PX is one of the larger on the Camp, as it stretches on two floors. Upstairs is mostly reserved for clothes and the most commonly sought articles are jeans, of which PX has a wide variety. All in all, a trip to this PX can take many hours for avid shoppers!

The PX is open every day of the week, from 10AM to 8PM from Monday to Sunday.

Soldier's Store

The Soldier's Store may be a little hard to find for newcomers to Camp Butmir. It is not on any main route that Camp Butmir folk normally take. Still, for those willing to stretch their legs just a little further, the store can be found next to the Knez Bar.

The Soldier's Store is most famous for its wide variety of clothes. Even though their prices are on the high side for Camp Butmir, few will complain because of the quality you get for your money.

The Norwegian PX is one of those shops on Camp Butmir which offer a lot of articles, but to which people come to shop for specific pur-



poses. In this case, the Norwegian PX is famous for its handmade jumpers. Their perfumes are also highly sought-after.


The prices are average for Camp Butmir. The only real exception are their watches, which tend to be expensive as they are well-




middle of October 2007. I will be returning home in mid April 2008. For me this is my first mission abroad. I think it is very interesting
