



COMEUFOR Speech for victims of helicopter accident – 21st June 2008

On Thursday 19th June, a EUFOR Helicopter crashed north of Travnik. The accident resulted in the tragic deaths of two German and two Spanish Soldiers.

Military duty, by its very nature, exposes soldiers to dangerous situations. We accept this risk out of our sense of duty to our societies and to the global community.

All soldiers who serve here in Bosnia and Herzegovina as members of EUFOR do so to contribute to a better future for the People of this country. We do this on behalf of the European and the wider world community. This is a very important task and all who serve here should be proud of their contribution to the future of this nation.

Tragically some soldiers pay a higher price than others.

This is the case with our four colleagues who gave up their lives that day in promoting peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina. I assure you their lives were not in vain and the People of this country will be forever in their debt.

Our condolences go out to the families and friends of our fallen comrades and we pray that they be granted the strength to come to terms with their loss.

The dedication and professionalism of these four Soldiers will act as an example to all of us as we continue to do our work here in EUFOR. All who gave their lives for peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina will be forever in our memory.

May they rest in peace.




Bodies of two EUFOR German passengers (1st Lieutenant Tim Heinen & Master Sergeant Zoran Krakic) killed in the EUFOR helicopter accident on Thursday 19th June were repatriated on 24th June. They were flown to Germany after a short ceremony at Sarajevo Airport.







The bodies of the two Spanish EUFOR Air Crew killed in the crash (Lt Santiago Hormigo & Sergeant Joaquin Lopez), were repatriated to Spain on 20th June.





They were all posthumously awarded their European Union Operation ALTHEA medals, after giving the ultimate sacrifice in the loss of their lives to the mission in BIH.

The cause of the crash remains under investigation.

EUFOR PIFWC Operation Against Karadzic Supporter Kosta Cavoski


EUFOR conducted and focussed a search operation in the premises of East Sarajevo University, assigned to Mr Kosta Cavoski, in Pale on 30th May at approximately 0430. The aim of the operation was to find material and/or information which could assist the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia ICTY in the ongoing search for and capture of persons indicted by The Hague Tribunal for War Crimes and putting pressure on networks believed to be involved in protecting these persons. Operation was conducted at the request of the ICTY and a number of items were taken from the scene for examination.

NATO support

Mr Kosta Cavoski is a member of the Truth about Karadzic Commission, which are supporters of Mr Radovan Karadzic, and who is regularly at the University in Pale. EUFOR believes Mr Cavoski uses his links with Pale to support the fugitive Mr Karadzic. The operation was supported by

NATO and was closely coordinated with the ICTY.

This operation is legally based upon the mandate of the ICTY, EUFOR and NATO under the relevant UN Security Council Resolutions and the General



The local police, RS MuP, were informed of the operation and provided support. We would wish to emphasise that the initiation of this operation and significant elements of the security are being performed by the RS MuP. We commend them for their professionalism, courage and commitment.



IPU with RS MuP

We would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone that any person providing information that leads to the arrest or conviction, in any country, of a war criminal indicted by the ICTY may be eligible for a reward. A reward of \$5m may be paid for Radovan Karadzic, Ratko Mladic or Goran Hadzic. Moreover Serbia has pledged a number of rewards, including £250,000 for Karadzic. NATO and EUFOR Commanders delighted at arrest of Zupljanin

War crimes suspect Stojan Zupljanin was arrested in Belgrade on 11th June. He is one of the four top Serb leaders wanted for war crimes by the United Nations tribunal in the Hague. He had been wanted for 13 years. He was arrested at an apartment just 5 miles from the center of Belgrade. He will now be sent to the Hague tribunal to stand trial on charges of crimes against humanity after being taken to an investigative judge in Belgrade.

EUFOR continues its efforts

networks supporting PIFWCs contributed to the successful arrest of Stojan Zupljanin by Serbian authorities.



On the 2nd June, the Prime Minister of Slovakia Robert Fico, with the minister of defence, Varoslav Basca, visited COM EUFOR, and they attended the Slovak Medal Parade.

Undersecretary of Chilean Navy began an Official visit to Bosnia and Herzegovina.

On 29th May, the Undersecretary of Chilean Navy, Carolina Echeverria Moya, together with two Chilean Senators, started an official visit to Bosnia and Herzegovina (BIH). They had a meeting with the Chilean Troops that are a part of EUFOR.

As part of the tour, Undersecretary Moya visited the national contingents deployed in the towns of Sanski Most and Prijedor.

On Friday 30th May, Undersecretary Carolina Echeverria Moya moved to Camp Butmir, Headquarters of EUFOR, Sarajevo. She had a meeting with the High Representative for Bosnia and Herzegovina, Miroslav Lajcák.

Subsequently, the Undersecretary had a meeting with Defense Minister of BIH, Selmo Cikotic.

Undersecretary Moya spoke about how the mission developed for the Chilean people in BIH. Furthermore

she sent her greetings to the Regional Coordination Center (RCC) 1 and especially to the Dutch people within the RCC1. She

thanked RCC 1 for the support and the working and living condition of the Chilean soldiers. Undersecretary Moya said: "It is very complicated because they work far away from their country. But it is easier to be in a mission like this when the people living and working here have good conditions. Chile is an important country in

South America and at this moment it is also important for Europe, especially in the cooperation for this EUFOR mission".

The Corps of Military Attaches Visits EUFOR

HQ EUFOR hosted a visit of the multinational Corps of the Military

Attaches on 4th June. The visitors comprised of representatives from ten countries who are all employed in positions within BIH, and are contributing nations to the EUFOR mission. The only exceptions are China and Russia, who expressed a keen interest in the effectiveness of the EUFOR mission in BIH.

The Military Attaches were informed of the wide range of work

undertaken by EUFOR. Focus was placed on the commitment of EUFOR to continue to guarantee peace and a safe and secure environment, whilst working with International Community and agencies in development of the stability of Bosnia and Herzegovina. The Military Attaches found the visit very informative and hugely beneficial to their work.

Combined Exercises between EUFOR and AFBIH Forces

Multinational Battalion (MNBN) conducted two combined exercises with AFBIH at the end of May. These exercises are a part of a training regime scheduled by MNBN in which all companies of the Battalion cooperate with AFBIH units.

First, B Coy of MNBN has conducted exercises from 20th to 23rd of May in the Training area of Eagle Base/Comanche Base (Tuzla) and Pasa Bunar fire range. Spanish Company carried out the training with AFBIH Company composed by the command element and two platoons from the Battalion from Orasje and the third platoon from the explorer Company, 6th Brigade of AFBIH.



During this, the companies, within the context of the Peace Support Operations (PSO), performed the following exercises:

- Rifle shooting exercise in Pasa Bunar fire range with the active participation of AFBIH Platoon using the night vision sights and weaponry of the B Company. Cross training was carried out using both AFBIH M-16 and

Spanish HK G-36 rifles too.

- MOUT (breaching into and searching a house) basic training at squad level.
- Check point drills. AFBIH Companies have considered this kind of training as police drills, but after the training, they started thinking about creating a standard operating procedure about check points in order to prepare for a possible deployment in Afghanistan or Iraq.

"Training with Spanish Company in MOUT an checkpoints drills were the most useful activities for us and the use of night vision equipment was the most appreciating activity due to the lack of this kind of material in our units", AFBIH Company Commander pointed out after the cooperation.

A second exercise was conducted by C Coy of MNBN from 26th to 30th of May, also in the Training area of Eagle Base/Comanche Base (Tuzla). This cooperation has been the last one scheduled by MNBN among companies of the Battalion and AFBIH units. Polish Company carried

out the training together with a BIH platoon from the Bijeljina's Infantry Brigade.

The following exercises were performed during this time by the units: CRC, MOUT training and VIP protection. Night Vision Goggles (NVG) equipment was also used. The training was followed by a tactical exhibition on 28th May for COM EUFOR and COM MNBN.

This cooperation was very satisfactory for both units. VIP escort and MOUT training were something new for AFBIH platoon so they were excited and eager to work and learn. Apart from this, MOUT and checkpoint drills were the most useful training for AFBIH because of the possibility that they will be deploying to Afghanistan soon.

Italian National Day

Italian military contingent of EUFOR honored Italian National Day – the Festivital of the Republic – with a ceremony held on 3rd of June in Camp Butmir.

Various military, civilian and religious authorities were present on the ceremony that celebrated the 62nd anniversary of the Italian Constitution.

Brigadier General Roberto D'Alessandro, as representative of the nation's military, welcomed the Italian

After the Ambassador read the message from the Italian President, honors to the fallen have been given on notes of the "Piave", played by the AFBIH band.

Hungarian National Day

Hungary celebrated the Day of National Defence on 21st May. The occasion of the celebration is occupation of the Buda Castle on 21st May in 1849.

Every year on 21st May Hungarian people remember the heroes who lined up as soldiers under the tricolour of the nation on 21st May 1849, and faced death bravely, singing the national anthem while attacking the strongholds of the enemy.

2008 is very special year, because the Hungarian Defence Force is 160 years old

in this year. In Camp Butmir the Hungarian Contingent celebrated this occasion on 24th May, and they organized a National Day celebration.

To celebrate a National Day is a tradition at the EUFOR

Multinational Battalion (MNBN) which includes the Hungarian Contingent. The



common purpose is meeting other cultures, and developing team spirit inside EUFOR.

Portuguese National Day

sonnel, that the event had its most significant impact. Over 400 people attended the Portuguese dinner barbeque and gathered around the typically seasoned meet and sardines, with the sound of Fado (Portuguese national music) as the background.

Anniversary of Carabinieri Corps



On the 5th June the Carabinieri Corps celebrated its 194th anniversary of foundation.

The Carabinieri Corps, synthesis of military and police Force, took part and is still participating in most of the peace support operations and stabilization missions in which the Italian Armed Forces have been involved worldwide.

In Bosnia and Herzegovina the Carabinieri have been present since the very first moment of the international commitment for the resolution of the conflict and they are still significantly represented within the EUPM and the IPU.

"Robust Police Forces" approach

The Integrated Police Unit (IPU) was deployed for the first time in 2004, coinciding with the transition phase from SFOR to EUFOR, receiving inheritance from the Multinational Specialized Unit, the first multinational force lead by the Carabinieri

Corps. IPU today represents one of the fundamental pillars of the operational contribution offered by the European Union to ensure a safe and secure environment in this Country.

During the past year

the profitable employment in Peace Support Operation (PSO) of the so-called "robust Police Forces" has taken another significant step forward in this operational Theatre. EUROGENDFOR (EGF) is an outstanding multinational project that bonds the Police Forces with military status from France, Italy, the Netherlands, Portugal, and Spain.

High price paid by Benemerita

Born in 2005, the EGF confirms the best traditions of the Forces that constitute it and

> proposes itself as a new tool at the disposal of the international community for crisis management operations, both under a military or a civilian chain of command. As an evidence of the peculiar integration capabilities distinguish Carabinieri Corps as well as the EGF, today we can see a representative of the IPU Forces and one of the

Carabinieri Corps historical references



The ancient Corps of the Royal Carabinieri was instituted in Turin by the King of Sardinia, Vittorio Emanuel I by Royal Warrant on 13th July, 1814. It was given the dual function of national defence, in first position with respect to other branches of the Armed Forces, and policing with special powers and prerogatives. The

Force was given a territorial task and was organized into divisions, one for each province. The mounted division "Corazzieri" was formed in 1868 as an escort of honour and security, first for the Sovereign, and since 1946 for the President of the Republic.

The privileged position, as well as the presence of Carabinieri in every part of Italy, even in the smallest village, were and still are the most significant characteristics of the Institution.

For the achievement of its mission the Carabinieri Corps has paid a high price in terms of human lives, in Italy as well as abroad, including Bosnia and Herzegovina.

In the 194th anniversary of its foundation, the Carabinieri Corps, proud of being part of the Italian Armed Forces, renovates its commitment in supporting the Country and Europe; confirms its unconditional dedication to the service, and its spirit of self-sacrifice, which earned it the appellative of Benemerita (this means Meritorious).

Rafting excursion of RCC4

On 10th May members of RCC 4 and its LOTs went for a rafting excursion on the Neretva river.

Following an idea of RCC4's HQSqdLdr, Chief RCC 4 Col Teichmann proposed this trip to the 10 LOTs of RCC 4 Area of Responsibility (AOR) as a multinational, teambuilding measure. The main purpose was to give all RCC and LOT members the opportunity to meet and get to know each other in circumstences other than through work. It is hoped that this environment could ease and speed up the process of exchange of experience and promote the development of mutual understanding.

Breathtaking landscape

The 24 participants, 12 Austrians, 11 Finnish and one interpreter, met around 1000 in the morning at the rafting base Ivo in the vicinity of Dzajica near Konjic. After the introduction and a small second breakfast. everybody chose their Neoprene suit. The whole group was brought upstream some 25 km to the starting point by bus, while the boats had already been transported via an additional vehicle. Upon arrival helmets and life jackets were received as well as some basic instructions.

Finally, the paddling down the Neretva

through an impressive scenery started. The river has, over the centuries, cut very deep into the rocky ground and thereby formed a breathtaking gorge worth seeing. When the river itself needed more attention due to more challenging waters, the crews of the four boats tried to either

overtake or at least ram each other and by these actions raising both levels of fitness as well as fun.




the tour continued without further highlights except for the aforementioned beauty of the surrounding mountains and valleys.


Agressive walls







The EU's annual Open Day is organized by the EU Commission and the EU Consilium in order to



Sarajevo Blues

One of Bosnia's most prominent poets and writers, Semezdin Mehmedinovic is the author of four books and has worked as an editor, journalist, and filmmaker. With Benjamin Filipovic he co-wrote and co-directed Mizaldo, one of the first Bosnian films made during the recent war in Bosnia-Herzegovina. After the war, Mehmedinovic and his family came to the U.S. as political refugees, settling in Alexandria, Virginia.

The English translation of his spare and haunting Sarajevo Blues, written under the horrific circumstances of the war, was praised by The Washington Post as one of the best literary documents of the conflict. Paul Auster writes that the book "is at once a battle report and a philosophical investigation, [charting] the collapse of a world with heart-breaking clarity and precision."

Mehmedinovic's most recent volume of poems, Nine Alexandrias, was translated by Alcalay and published by City Lights in 2003.

In Rajko Grlic's *Karaula*, for all its ribaldry, every detail from the past seems freighted with an irony that hits out at the past and reverberates into



My best result was the 5th place in the World championship 2003, that took place in Toledo (Spain). I like to participate in gymnastic circuits of the Camp Butmir Gym too.




